

Foods of the World Project

Students will present a recipe of a native dish from their country. You will write about the dish, presenting some cultural background information, and you will also explain why the dish is special to you. You can use pictures from your country and a drawing of the dish to illustrate the recipe. The recipes will be compiled into an ESOL cookbook.

The written portion of the project will be in the following form:



Name of the Dish

Introduction

- Cultural Background (the country and region of the dish)
- Where and when the dish is prepared.
- Why the dish is special or significant to me.

Materials

- A list of materials necessary to prepare the dish (utensils, pots/pans, kitchen appliances)

Ingredients

- A list of ingredients and necessary amounts or quantities

Recipe

- A clear, step-by-step recipe for preparing the dish. A stranger should be able to prepare the dish correctly, based on your recipe! Each major step in preparing the dish should be a small, separate paragraph.

Additional Elements (one or more of the following)

- photographs of the native country/region (your own photographs, not something taken from the Internet)
- a simple line drawing of the dish
- a line drawing of native country's map
- a proverb or wise saying from the native country or region
